There has been a noticeable increase in the number of students at the elementary building who are wearing apple watches and have a personal cell phone during school. Given the fact that we have a cell phone policy in the parent handbook but no set policy regarding apple watches, we felt it was necessary to address the issue. We realize that many parents provide their children with these devices for safety reasons. Therefore, we understand that students will bring them to school. Students can use them immediately upon arrival or at dismissal. Other than that, they should remain turned off and put away for safekeeping during the school day, most importantly during instructional time.

Cell phones and smartwatches that are being used to make calls, text (parents or peers) or play games during the school day may be confiscated and returned to students at the end of the day.

Please note the following:

During the school day such devices

- may not be turned on or used during instructional time, except for instructional and educational purposes with the explicit approval of the teacher and/or teaching artist.
- may not be turned on or used during lunch or recess.
- may not be turned on or used in the bathroom or locker room.
- may not be turned on or used during field trips, fire drills, or lockdown drills.
- may not be turned on or used during NYS exams.

Students are asked not to call, text, or message their family members during the school day. If students need to reach a member of their family, they are more than welcome to use the phone in the main office.
